Spring Updates

A number of long-term projects have been completed in time for the busy 2024 season at Malabar Farm State Park. These include both Park management plans and Malabar Farm Foundation funded projects. The first of these was the Ohio Department of Natural Resource's grand opening of its new exhibit area in the Visitor Center.



For its part the Malabar Farm Foundation has completed several long-term projects that it was pleased to support. Foremost among these was the much needed restoration and re-painting of some 80 exterior shutters on Louis Bromfield's Big House. The Jimmy Reynolds 2-section painted panel from Louis Bromfield's Study has also been repaired and cleaned. At some time in the past a serious hole had been accidently punched into one of the panels, and over the years the edges of the pieces had been chipped and frayed. The expert staff at the non-profit Intermuseum Conservation Association (ICA) located in Cleveland, Ohio did an excellent job of repairing the damage. Cleaning of the piece also restored bright colors that were long hidden under dirt and nicotine stains. (Louis Bromfield was a heavy smoker.)

James "Jimmy" Reynolds was a costume and set designer on Broadway. His work there extended for 1919 to 1943. After that he began to travel, write, and paint. In addition to the above panel he designed much of the wallpaper in Malabar's Big House. Reynolds also painted a watercolor still-life that hangs in Mary Bromfield's bedroom. 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The ICA was also able to clean, repair, and provide for the long-term preservation of the first of two original Bromfield 1940s era bedspreads in the Honeymoon Room in the Big House. This is the bedroom that was shared by Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall following their wedding at Malabar Farm on May 21, 1945.



Combined Foundation funding for the shutter project, the Reynolds panel, and the bedspread came to \$20,075.

In addition to the above projects, the Foundation recently provided \$475 to repair a Big House bathroom wall that had been damaged by a broken hot water pipe, and approved \$279 to replace 10 bluebird boxes in the Park. Last December the Foundation approved \$11,000 for the repair and painting of the three iconic cupolas on the main barn near the big House. We look forward to this work being completed sometime this spring.

In the February Newsletter it was noted that the Malabar Farm Foundation was one of the sponsors of the Johnny Appleseed Historic Byways traveling exhibit celebrating the 250th birthday of this American folk hero.

Listening to the Past and Seeing the Future: Bromfield, Bogart, and Bacall - The Untold Stories

In two recent columns, we reviewed several little-known facets of Louis Bromfield's career. The first involved the rediscovery of an unpublished Bromfield essay titled *Before It's Too Late – What Went Before*, which turned out to be a non-literary expression of Bromfield's philosophy of history.

The second involved two articles about Ford Maddox Ford, one written by Robert Lowell and the other by Bromfield. What was intriguing about the articles was that both Lowell and Bromfield complained extensively about Ford's shortcomings, shortcomings which, ironically, they both possessed and yet about which they seemed unaware.

Recently, several new stories have emerged about Bromfield. These stories involve Malabar Farm's most well-known visitors, Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall.

The stories are found in *Bogey and Bacall: The Surprising True Story of Hollywood's Greatest Love Affair*, written by William J. Mann and published by Harper Collins. In the book we find several stories about Bromfield, Bogart, and Bacall, that are little known and rarely discussed, even among those of us who do such "discussing" on a regular basis.

Bromfield, Malabar Farm, and members of the Malabar Farm Family including George Hawkins appear in these brief but significant narratives. The first occurs in the early years of Bromfield's relationship with Bogart. During that time, Bromfield recalls that, while trying to re-establish himself on Broadway, he (Bogart) "sometimes . . . did not know where his next meal was coming from." However, during this same period, Bromfield also praises Bogart's dedication to his role as Duke Mantee in the on-stage version

of *The Petrified Forest*, when he notes that, Bogart had "sacrificed his good looks by cropping his beard so short that his head appeared to be shaved."

The second narrative occurs when we learn that, before the Bogie-Bacall wedding, Bogart visited Malabar Farm many times with his then wife, Methot Mayo. Bogart and Mayo were known to their friends as the Battling Bogarts, a reputation which they had earned because of their many public battles, usually fueled by large quantities of alcohol.

However, Mann also reports that the couple never fought when they were comfortably ensconced on the farm in Ohio. According to Bromfield, when the Battling Bogarts visited Malabar, they were as well-behaved as a minister and his wife. Apparently, Bromfield enjoyed their company so much that he repeatedly asked them to return to the farm. On one occasion he wrote, "We miss you both very much . . . everyone here sends you much love and more and more success to you both –our favorite couple."

The final narrative involves the legendary Bogie-Bacall wedding of May 21, 1945, at which Bromfield served as Bogart's best man and George Hawkins, Bromfield's good friend and business manager, served as the father-of-the-bride.

Bromfield's role is not unexpected. After all, Bogart and the Boss had been drinking buddies for years. Their relationship was the stuff of legends, and so it would have been odd to see Bromfield sitting on the sidelines during such an important event.

But what about Hawkins? Why did Bacall ask Hawkins, rather than a close relative, to give her away? The fact that her father did not attend the wedding surprised no one. Her father had, at least according to her mother, abandoned the family when Bacall was very young. Her father, of course, tells a different story, noting that the impression of abandonment was planted in his daughter's mind by her mother, his former wife.

Still, this does not explain the absence of Bacall's two uncles, Jack and Charlie, who had supported Bacall and her mother, at least in part, emotionally and financially, for many years. Mann offers several explanations for their absence from the wedding, but also admits, "there may have been other reasons too."

Finally, the most interesting, least known, and most atypical story about the Bogie-Bacall wedding, in fact, perhaps, the most unusual story about Bogart himself, came from Bacall, who, on the day of her marriage to Hollywood's ultimate tough guy, remarked after the service, "Bogie shed tears all through the ceremony . . . He cries at weddings. He's very cute about it."
